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Request for Proposal Emergency Hazardous Material Spill Response Jefferson County, Pennsylvania

The County of Jefferson is now accepting proposals from vendors to provide Emergency Hazardous Material Spill Response for the political boundaries of Jefferson County, Pennsylvania. In order to meet the requirements of Act 165 of 1990, known as the Hazardous Material Emergency Planning & Response Act, Jefferson County seeks proposals as follows:

- The vendor must agree to follow standards set forth by the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) in regards to certification, standards for training, equipment, safety and operations.
- Standards for certifying response teams with several preparedness levels patterned after levels established by the United States Occupational Safety and Health Administration at 29 CFR Part 1910.120.
- 3. Hazardous Material Response Teams shall comply with any guidelines, regulations, directives or other documents developed by PEMA, The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Council for incorporation into the Commonwealth's Hazardous Material Safety Program.

A certified hazardous material response team under Act 165 may, when authorized by the county emergency management coordinator, enter onto any private or public property on which a release of a hazardous material has occurred or the occurrence or the threat of a hazardous material release is imminent. A certified hazardous material response team may enter any adjacent or surrounding property to which the hazardous material release has entered or threatens to enter. A certified hazardous material response team may enter any private or public property in order to respond to the release or threatened release of a hazardous material, to monitor and contain the hazardous material release, to perform cleanup and stabilization actions and to perform any other response activities deemed necessary by the certified hazardous material response team or by the representatives of PEMA, the county emergency management office as established under 35 Pa.C.S. Pt. V or the local committee.

Proposals should submit proof of insurance coverages and any documents pertaining to your hazardous material response team.
